

A NOTE ON NATIONAL SAMPLE SURVEY

A nation wide sample survey called the National sample survey(N.S.S) was nictitated by the Government of India in the Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance, in 1950 to collect statistical sampling comprehensive socio-economic data relating to different sector of the economy of the country. The absence of reliable and adequate statistics relating to production, consumption and other aspects of socio-economic life in India had been felt for a long time and more particularly during the 1st Five year plan period. The non coverage of household sector in India trough a large scale sample survey had increased the demand for socio economic statistics relating to structure and dynamic of the Governments economy. Besides it had become necessary to improve the coverage and accrue of the date on items such as manpower potentialities, national and state income, agricultural statistic etc. In order to fill this gap, the “ National Sample Survey “ was set up in 1950 under the able guidance of Prof.P.C Mahalanobis with the active support of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the than Prime minister of India.

The National Sample survey is a continuing multi subject integrated survey being conducted in the form of successive rounds, each round covering some topic of current interest. The scope, period and programme of each round are fixed by taking into account the nature of data required and the resources available for that period. Since the 14th round (1958-59) the survey period has been usually one complete year coinciding approximately with the agricultural year. However, the survey period for the 26th round was of fifteen months duration, and that for the 28th round only nine months.

PARTICIPATION OF STATES

The size of samples initially tried by the Government of India was small and it was very difficult to work out aggregates with any fair degree of precision. As a measure to overcome this difficult states have been advised in this programme and as such Tamil Nade has been participating in this survey programme on a full matching basic from 18th round which officially commenced from 1st Februry1963.

ORGANISATION SET UP

Up to the 64th round of the survey the subject coverage, sample design and tabulation programme for a round were final ised by the Central Statistical Organization on the recommendation of the National Sample Survey Programme committee. The technical work relating to details of sample design, preparation of schedules, instruction and sample data and preparation, of final reports, was however entrusted to the Indian Statistical Institute (I.S.I)

Since the 25th round (July 1970-1971) of the survey the subject coverage, sample deign and tabulation programme for a round are being finalized by the Governing council of the National Sample Survey Organization, Department of Statistics, Government of India . Since 1st June 1972 the entire work of National Sample Survey both technical and field work, in all the Statesis being done by the Sample Survey Organization (NSSO)

All the states except a few pockets in some of the states and some of the union territories are participating in the NSS porgramme on at least equal matching basis, to get more precise estimates for their respective states, the stat statistical Bureaus are in charge of field work, processing and tabulation of state sample data and preparation of reports.

METHODOLOGY

Entire programme of every round of survey is being designed by the NSSO as an annual feature since the survey contemplates studying varied topics of current interest. After pre-test and expertise discussion on the instruction to the field agency and formats of schedules to be canvassed in depth the survey programme of the year is released in its finial shape. The Central and state agencies are doing their field work independently with the samples allotted separately for Centre and State. The results are pooled later for comparison and release.

SAMPLE DESIGN

The general Sample design is a stratified multiple stage sampling in stratum from 65th round. The first stage units are 2001 census villages in rural areas and blocks in urban areas. The ultimate stage units are households. For towns with no UFS frame available, each town will be treated as an UFS. In case of large UFS's, one intermediate stage of sampling will be selection of two hamlet groups/sub-blocks from each rural/urban fsu.

STRATIFICAION

All villages of a District will form a separate stratum in rural sector.

For urban sector, the Strata will be formed within each NSS region on the basis of size class of towns as per census 2001 town population. This departure has been made in the stratification principle in order to facilitate generation of town-class wise estimates to satisfy the requirements of the user ministries.

Staffing Patten: S.S.B. Tamil Nadu

The survey has been conducted by a permanent whole-time train staff adopting methods of personal interview and direct physical observation for providing data are various topics of economic and agricultural characteristics with provision for (I) assessing precision of survey result (II) providing periodical progressive estimates and (III) other agencies such as State Government to participate in this work on equal matching basis in collaboration with National Sample Survey Organization.

At present the schedule canvassed by field staff are directly entered into Computer and they are sent to Head Quarters in the form of CD where data validation work is taken of by NSS section of this Department. At the head quarters, there are seven Statistical Officers in NSS Division attending to allotment of rural and urban sample, supply of forms and schedules to field staff, communication of amendments to field, receipt of field-in schedules and matters relating to general administration. The assignment of analysis and preparation of reports are the other important tasks executed by Statistical officers. And also the staff of NSS Division of this Department is taking up the work of machine tabulation, validation of data and generation of final tables.

FIELD WORK

The whole State of Tamil Nadu has been divided in to three regions as a part of regional set up. The name of districts comprised in each region in Tamil Naduis furnished below.

Canvassing of Schedules is being attended to by Assistant Statistical investigators who are specially trained for this purpose. One Statistical inspector in almost all these districts has been posted and he supervises the entire field work and also scrutinizes the filled in schedules. In the district level, the Assistant Director of Statistics of the respective district is giving all the guidance to the field staff for keeping up the time-schedule of the field work to collect required data adequately and accurately. The whole operation is also super-checked by a Deputy Director of Statistics and an Assistant Director of Statistics (NSS) from Chennai headquarters.

SUBJECT COVERAGE

Albeit the subject coverage has been varied for each round, the National Sample Survey covers the same topics / subjects at certain regular interval. Of course, the designing of schedule will be modified according to the changed needs. According to the NSSO the long term programme for its coverage is as under:

During the period of s decade the items proposed to be covered are;

- 1 Population, births, deaths, disability, morbidity,] fertility, maternity and child care and family planning.] Once in ten years
2. Dept and Investment and capital formation.]
3. Land-holdings and livestock enterprises.]
4. Employment and employment and Consumer Expenditure] Twice in ten years.
5. Unorganized enterprises in non-agricultural sectors]

As for as the Households consumer Expenditure, the survey has been conducted in every year except 65th round.

The five groups of subjects given above will cover, in all, seven out of ten year programme. The remaining years out of decade have been kept open for undertaking surveys on subjects unexplored so far also to accommodate special request from the Central and State Government.

The subject coverage from the inception of the NSS i.e., from 1st round (1950-1951) to 65th round (2008-2009) has been given in Appendix-1 of this note.

WORK DONE

The field work in respect of different enquiries in different rounds up to 64th round has been completed in full. The work relating to Machine Tabulation up to 63rd round has been completed. Final Table according to Tabulation plan to be generated up to 62nd round.

Up to NSS 54th round, reports relating to various rounds have been prepared on the basis of State Sample data in Tamil Nadu. At that time pooling of State Sample estimates with those of Central Sample estimates were not adopted. Pooling of Central and State sample estimates have been attempted first time during 55th round of NSS. Based on the pooled estimates sever reports have been drought out i.e. 55th round to 61st round.

Generation of final tables relating to NSS 62nd round is in progress in NSS section of this Department. The field work relating to NSS 65th round is in progress.

Though the sampling design is not altered, altogether, the scope of coverage of sector, the number of samples, designing of schedules, procedure for tabulation and estimation vary from one round to another depending on the nature of topics and the result envisaged. All such, the methodology sample designs are briefed in a general way rather than to focus it to any particular round. However, considering importance given for the survey results from the heterogeneous users, the national sample survey occupies a pivotal place for providing precise and reliable data in time for economic exercise and formulation of plans- schemes.
